My dear Sir

As Secretary to the  
Great Humane Society for the  
protection of the weak, I en-  
-close herewith a Debate which  
took place a few days ago  
in the Senate of the Dominion  
regarding the changing and  
changed conditions which sur-  
-round the Indians of our  
North West Territories - You  
will observe that <sup>reference</sup> is made  
in the motion upon which the  
debate <sup>occurred</sup> to your Great Society -  
The peaceful relations which

have, to Canada's honor, been  
maintained, thus far, with the  
aborigines, has been recently  
very much strained by the  
extinction of the Buffalo, and  
the evil example of the French  
Halfbreeds now in arms on  
the Saskatchewan River

So far the more important hands  
have stood aloof and strenuous  
efforts are being made for  
the putting down of the Rebellion  
and the protection of the Indians -  
Trusting that the Speeches  
of the Hon Sir Alex Campbell  
Leader of the Senate and myself  
upon the subject may be of
