me - We Damaras have always
been friends of the British. We have
given to the British the Port of Waluich
Bay we gave in 1876 to an Agent of
the Cape Colonial Government full
rights over our Country.

For some time they placed an
agent at Okohandja but he was with-
drawn.

Again last year we gave our
country over to the British.

We now hear that the Germans
wish to take over our Country, we
do not wish to have the Germans here
we never have given & never wish
to give our Country to them.

We have given our Country to the
British in the full expectation that
they would take it & protect us so that
we could sit still & enjoy the things
we possess. I say we look to the
great Queen of the British to protect us
& to fulfil those promises which were
made when we gave our Country over
to the British Government.

Now Sir, I have been told that you
can help us in this matter.

I say then help us & deliver us from
these Germans who seize our Country
without our wish and who bring
War & destruction upon us.

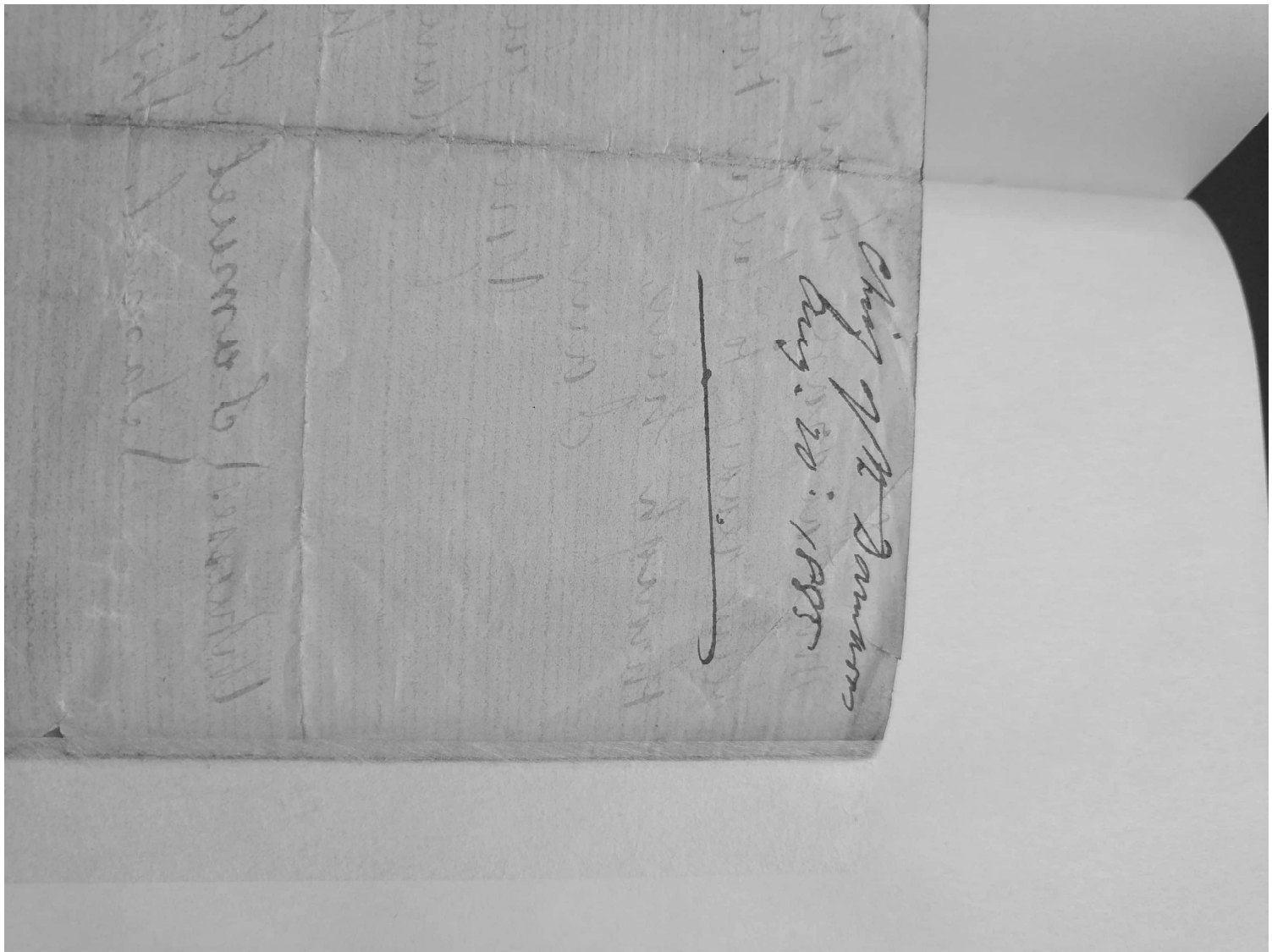
