LATEST NEWS FROM MONTSIOA'S

Our correspondent at Taungs, writes as

We learn from a gentleman who arrived yesterday from Rooi Grond, that three parties of Boers had left Rooi Grond last week, going west, towards Montsion's cattle posts. The people of Rooi Grond had killed their last ox, and have no meal or grain, so that they are obliged to send out parties for the purpose of stealing cattle in order to keep their people together. It is reported that they will go for Gasatsibi's cattle if they cannot find Montsioa's. party of the Rooi Grond people engage themselves in patrolling round the station and annoying the inhabitants whilst the others are searching for the cattle.
